A one year program
Three hours per day
Prerequisite: none
Possible job opportunities: Emergency Ambulance, fire Department, hospitals, industry emergency response teams

Would you like the ability to help others in a time of medical need? Would it be great to know what to do is someone were suffering from an allergic reaction, respiratory distress, or possibly a heart attack? The **EMT-B** program provides a year long program teaching such skills as these and gives you the confidence to act times of these emergency's.



Students learn hands on techniques for airway management. Airway adjuncts and suctioning techniques are being practiced by students.

Want to ride on an Ambulance, Fire Truck or work in the Emergency Room at the hospital? These are all opportunities given to **EMT** students.

A Sample of Class Activities/ Topics

The **EMT-B** course allows you to investigate various areas of the hospital while gaining your state certification. Whether it is Emergency Medicine on the street or in the Emergency Room, you can visit other areas of the hospital and see where your interest and desires really lie. Is it Nursing School and working in the hospital, maybe Medical School and become a doctor, or maybe Radiology and working in the X-Ray Department.

Students learn the respiratory system, heart anatomy and function, skeletal system, endocrine system, nervous system and more as they relate structure and function and actions to take during an emergency.
