Class Activities/Topics

Students learn about ladders, hose, fire streams, fire extinguishers, auto extrication, ventilation, forcible entry, power tools, self contained breathing apparatus (SCBA), emergency dispatch/communications, personal protective clothing, hazardous materials..... and much more. We take several field trips as they are related to the program. You can't learn how to become a fire fighter by sitting in a classroom, so we are outside or on the training ground frequently.
